Nutrition:

- Please eat a nutritious breakfast.
- Make sure you bring a lunch or have paid for a lunch at the lodge.

What your child should wear:

- □ Long underwear and a long-sleeve shirt (<u>layers</u> of clothes are important)
- A warm sweater
- Insulated, wind and water resistant jacket (parka) and pants
- □ A warm hat, scarves and ski socks
- Pack boots, or water resistant hiking boots
- Waterproof, insulated gloves or mittens
- Goggles or sunglasses
- □ Sunscreen and lip protection

YOUR SKIER RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- a. Skiers who ski in any area not designated for skiing within the permit assume the inherent risk thereof
- b. Skiers shall be the sole judges of the limits of their skills and their ability to meet and overcome the inherent risks of skiing and shall maintain reasonable control of speed and course
- c. Skiers shall abide by the directions and instructions of the ski area operator
- d. Skiers shall familiarize themselves with posted information on location and degree of difficulty of trails and slopes to the extent reasonably possible before skiing on any slope or trail
- e. Skiers shall not cross the uphill track of any surface lift except at points clearly designated by the ski area operator
- f. Skiers shall not overtake any other skier except in such manner as to avoid contact and shall grant the right-of-way to the overtaken skier
- g. Skier shall yield to other skiers when entering a trail or starting downhill
- h. Skiers must wear retention straps or other devices to prevent runaway skis
- i. Skiers shall not board rope tows, wire rope tows, J-bars, ski lifts, or other similar devices unless they have sufficient ability to use the devices, and skiers shall follow any written or verbal instructions that are given regarding the devices.
- j. Skiers, when involved in a skiing accident, shall not depart from the ski area without leaving their names and addresses if reasonably possible
- k. A skier who is injured should, if reasonably possible, give notice of the injury to the ski area operator before leaving the ski area
- Skiers shall not embark or disembark from a ski lift except at designated area or by the authority of the ski area operator

ADDITIONAL GENERAL RULES:

- NEVER SKI ALONE
- No skiing in parking lots
- During night skiing, do not ski unlit trails
- If a lift stops, sit quietly: do not jump or swing skis
- Obey and do not be disrespectful to coaches, chaperones, or fellow skiers/snowboarders
- No foul language
- No drugs, alcohol, or tobacco (suspension without refund)
- Do not stop a runaway ski. Instead shout a warning
- No roughhousing. Respect others' property
- ALL PARTICIPANTS SHOULD CARRY THEIR OWN ACCIDENT INSURANCE.

Skier Type Descriptions

Skier Type I

"Cautious skiing at lighter release/retention settings." Skis conservatively. Prefers slower speeds. Prefers easy, moderate slopes. Favors lower than average release/retention settings. (This corresponds to an increased risk of inadvertent binding release in order to gain increased releaseability in a fall.) Type I settings apply to entry level skiers uncertain of their classification.

Skier Type II

"Moderate skiing at average release/retention settings." Ski Moderately. Prefers a variety of speeds. Skis on varied terrain, including most difficult trails. Are all skiers who do not meet all the descriptions of either Type I or Type III.

Skier Type III

"Aggressive skiing at higher release/retention settings." Skis aggressively. Normally skis at high speeds. Prefers steeper and more challenging terrain. Favors higher than average release/retention settings. (This corresponds to decreased releaseability in a fall in order to gain a decreased risk of inadvertent binding release.)
